2024-2025 Freshmen **Scholarships and Financial Aid** for Mississippi Residents

A University of Mississippi education is an exceptional investment in your future. The Office of Financial Aid at Ole Miss can provide all of the information you need to understand the various financial aid programs available.

At Ole Miss, we offer everything from academic merit-based scholarships to need-based scholarships. One key thing about our scholarships is that some of them have different deadlines. To be considered for any scholarship, you must first apply to Ole Miss, and then submit the online Special Programs & Scholarship Application. Please be aware that the scholarship section should be completed by the deadline of January 10th.

Federal and State Aid Options

Some families may need to consider grants, student and parent loans, or student employment in addition to scholarships to help meet the cost of attending the university. It's important to understand how all types of financial aid work and what steps you can take now to plan ahead. We recommend that you complete the FAFSA each year at **studentaid.gov** for federal aid eligibility and that you also apply for state financial aid at **msfinancialaid.org.** Please visit finaid.olemiss.edu to review all options in detail and for a list of our scholarships.

Scholarships

FREE MONEY! Scholarships are awarded based on different factors including merit, financial need, and talent in areas such as academics, athletics, and music.

Grants

ALSO FREE MONEY! They usually require a demonstration of financial need, and are often provided by government sources.

Loans

Funds for students and parents that will eventually have to be repaid with interest.

Federal Work-Study

A part-time job opportunity (typically on-campus) for students who demonstrate financial need.



Special Programs

Students with outstanding academic and leadership records may wish to apply for admission and scholarships to one of our special programs (see chart on flip-side). Automatic Scholarships

Mississippi Star Student Scholarship \$8,000 (\$2,000 per year)

Mississippi All-Star Scholarship \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year)

Mississippi Boys State/Girls State Scholarship \$1.000 one-year only

Sumners Scholarship For residents of the following counties: Attala, Carroll, Choctaw, Montgomery, or Webster \$8,000 per year

High School Valedictorian/Salutatorian Scholarship \$6.000 (\$1,500 per year)

Student Body President Scholarship \$6,000 (\$1,500 per year)

Eagle Scout/Gold Award \$6,000 (\$1,500 per year)

Boys State/Girls State Scholarship \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year)

Ole Miss Opportunity

Award Amount: (Unique Benefits Package)

This guarantee program provides a benefits package that covers tuition plus allowances for housing and meals. For 2023-24, this guarantee of basic costs is valued at \$20,290. OMO funding will "fill the gap" up to this cap after other scholarships/grants have been considered. Students will also get priority for a Work-Study job if desired, plus participation in the FASTrack program for freshmen.

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshmen whose 2022 family income is below or at \$40,000 (as reported on the FAFSA), 3.0 high school GPA, and eligible for the Federal Pell Grant.

HOW TO APPLY: Submit the FAFSA by the March 1 priority FAFSA filing date for automatic consideration. Submit the State of Mississippi Financial Aid Application for the MS HELP, MTAG and MESG grants (priority consideration may be given to those who file it by March 31).

Luckyday

Award Amount: \$24,000 (\$6,000 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshmen from Mississippi with a 20 ACT or higher (940 SAT) and 3.2 or higher GPA. Selection is competitive and considers grades, test scores, leadership activities, and Luckyday essay. Participation in the Luckyday program is required. 80 new freshmen are chosen each year.

Stamps Scholarship

Award Amount: Up to Cost of Attendance after other awards are counted. The package includes a \$12,000 stipend for educational activities outside the classroom, including study abroad, research, and other enrichment pursuits.

ELIGIBILITY: Students who will "change the world." Entering freshmen with exceptional academic and leadership records.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete the online Special Programs & Scholarship Application. Students will be nominated for consideration and will interview with the nationally recognized Stamps Scholar Program.

W. R. Newman Scholarship & **Robert M. Carrier Scholarship**

Award Amount: \$40,000 (\$10,000 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshmen who are Mississippi residents; exceptional academic and leadership record required.

HOW TO APPLY: Gain admission to the University of Mississippi. Students will be nominated for consideration and selected by a scholarship committee.

Academic Excellence Scholarship National Merit Semifinalist/Finalist Award

Award Amount: Includes full tuition scholarship and the standard cost of a double occupancy room in a campus residence hall. Please be advised that these awards are renewable for up to four years as long as all terms and conditions are met. Cannot be combined with Academic Merit.

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshmen with National Merit Semifinalist/Finalist status and a 3.0 or higher high school GPA.

HOW TO APPLY: Gain admission to the University of Mississippi. Provide documentation of National Merit standing.

National Merit Finalist Award

Award Amount: \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshmen with finalist status and selection of Ole Miss as first choice and who are not receiving a National Merit Corporate award.

HOW TO APPLY: Gain admission to the University of Mississippi. Select Ole Miss as first-choice school with the National Merit office.

Barnard National Merit Scholarship

Award Amount: \$20,000 (\$5,000 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshmen who have achieved National Merit Finalist status and have a 3.0 or higher high school GPA.

HOW TO APPLY: Gain admission to the University of Mississippi. Provide documentation of National Merit standing.

Mississippi First Scholarship

Award Amount: \$12,000 (\$3,000 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Entering freshman from Mississippi with at least a 3.75 HS GPA who did not receive an academic merit scholarship.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete the online Special Programs & Scholarship Application.

OMWC Scholarship

Award Amount: \$40.000 (\$10,000 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Academic and leadership record is considered. Some scholarships may be need-based. Participation in the OMWC program is required.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete Special Programs & Scholarship Application. In some cases, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is also required.

Ole Miss First Scholarship Award

Award Amount: \$18,000 (\$4,500 per year)

ELIGIBILITY: Academic and leadership record is considered. Some scholarships may be need-based. Participation in the Ole Miss First program is required.

HOW TO APPLY: Complete the Special Programs & Scholarship Application. In some cases, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is also required.

National Recognition Scholarship

Covers full tuition and traditional campus housing valued at \$60,376 over four years (\$15,094 per year). This scholarship is not stackable with Academic Merit or National Merit Scholarships, however, it can be combined with many of the university's competitive scholarships and other awards.
